Therefore, the idea to establish a Heritage study centre is inculcating for students' value added education.

The Vision and Mission of The Heritage Study Centre formed in the session 2019-2020

VISION

- 1) The Heritage study centre can play an important role to promote, preserve and create documents on Indian cultural heritage and Indian identity. The faculty members and the students associated with this centre might trace the society's roots of extinct culture.
- 2) The Heritage study centre is designed to create awareness about the rich tradition of the locality and generating interest and basic understanding about the Indian cultural heritage among our students.
- 3) This centre aims to make a bridge between the local communities and our institution. Our socio-academic interest is to create awareness regarding the local history and rich Indian tradition among the neighbouring people. The Heritage study centre can foreground the rich aspects of cultural heritage of this locality by unearthing interesting tells of communal harmony.
- 4) This centre aims to rediscover the lost stories of nineteenth centuries literary stalwarts of this area. One of the greatest contributors of Bengal Renaissance, Michael Madhusudan Dutt, Hem Chandra Bandyopadhyay and their literary works contains the heritage of this area as well. The centre is also keen to organise seminar, heritage walk(to the residence of Poet Madhusudan Dutt at Khiderpur),Film show to rediscover the cultural heritage.
- 5) Our vision is to develop the skill of our students in mainly three fold ways--- (a) to give them exposure to multiple academic events (b) to encourage them for presenting papers, making short videos, cultural shows, organising and conducting prestigious festivals, (c) awarding certificates as a mark of recognition of their efforts.
- (6) The Centre 's vision is to create heritage volunteers amongst students, with proper knowledge, for heritage walk and guided heritage tour.
- (7) Thus the centre aims to create opportunities for the students to build further careers in Tourism Management courses too.
- (8) The Heritage study centre offers alternative space for study regarding our heritage and deep rooted Indian culture to our students -----★ by landscape documentation, ★ Digital Training, ★ Interviewing local people,★

making independent documentary films ★ Cultivating the culture of unique food, oral history, craftsmanship, as a symbol of local heritage.

(9) Thus, the centre aims to create opportunities to open self help groups, start up businesses by our students in future, for their economic support.

(10) Our vision is to have a collaborative publication unit, which will regularly publish articles, books, photo stories related to the locality and beyond.

(11) The heritage study Centre's most important vision is to organise workshops, conferences, seminars, awareness programmes, festivals to project the symphony of cultural milieu.

THE MISSION

Student oriented mission

1) Students exchange programmes between neighbouring colleges for monthly talk on Indian cultural heritage, local history and culture. The talk will be delivered by the experts of the relevant subject.

2) Heritage walks could be organised by our interested faculty members, students and associating partners like " Know Your Neighbour ". Few numbers of external participants will be welcomed in such neighbourhood walks for creating awareness and generating funds for organising more programme / publications.

(3) A short term Certificate Course or workshop on Heritage Study, ie, Research Methodology on preservation and promotion of heritage could be organised for the interested students ; preferably for the alumni. This course pattern might incorporate interdisciplinary topics, research methodology at UG level, videography, podcasting, photography, article / content writing, heritage preservation methods, local heritage landscape analysis, cultural and historical studies, concept of Museology, Digital Humanities, Migrant Studies etc.

(4) Exhibition of photographs of Heritage Buildings and religious places to demonstrate the diversity and history of peaceful co existence of different communities.

Research oriented mission for the faculties and researchers

1) In depth research on local cultural history, socio-economic history, port oriented history, history of migrants, Local Culinary history and the revisited the history of the greatest contributors of Bengal Renaissance from the area of Kolkata 700023.

2) Annual publication and research outcomes in peer reviewed journals.

3) Annual conference and International, National, State level seminar on heritage and cultural studies.

4) Diversity programme to increase awareness, popularity of local culture and make an understanding about larger perspectives of Bengali / Indian culture.

5) Heritage walk and associated academic work

6) Collaboration with West Bengal Government 's Heritage Department, INTACH and other Governmental or Non Governmental organizations for conducting more research on the cultural heritage of this locality , both tangible and intangible ; Will approach the Heritage Department for research and publication funds.

(7) Collaboration with the Tourism Department for generating interest of the tourists to visit this locality and explore the history, culture and food of College locality.

(8) Beyond the local history, religion, culture and language our mission is to expand our students' interest, knowledge and research aptitudes towards the deep rooted history of Indian cultural heritage.

(9) To extend our work, our mission is to give proposals for collaborative ventures to The Indian Museum, The Archeological Survey of India, Alipur Jail Museum, Victoria Memorial also.

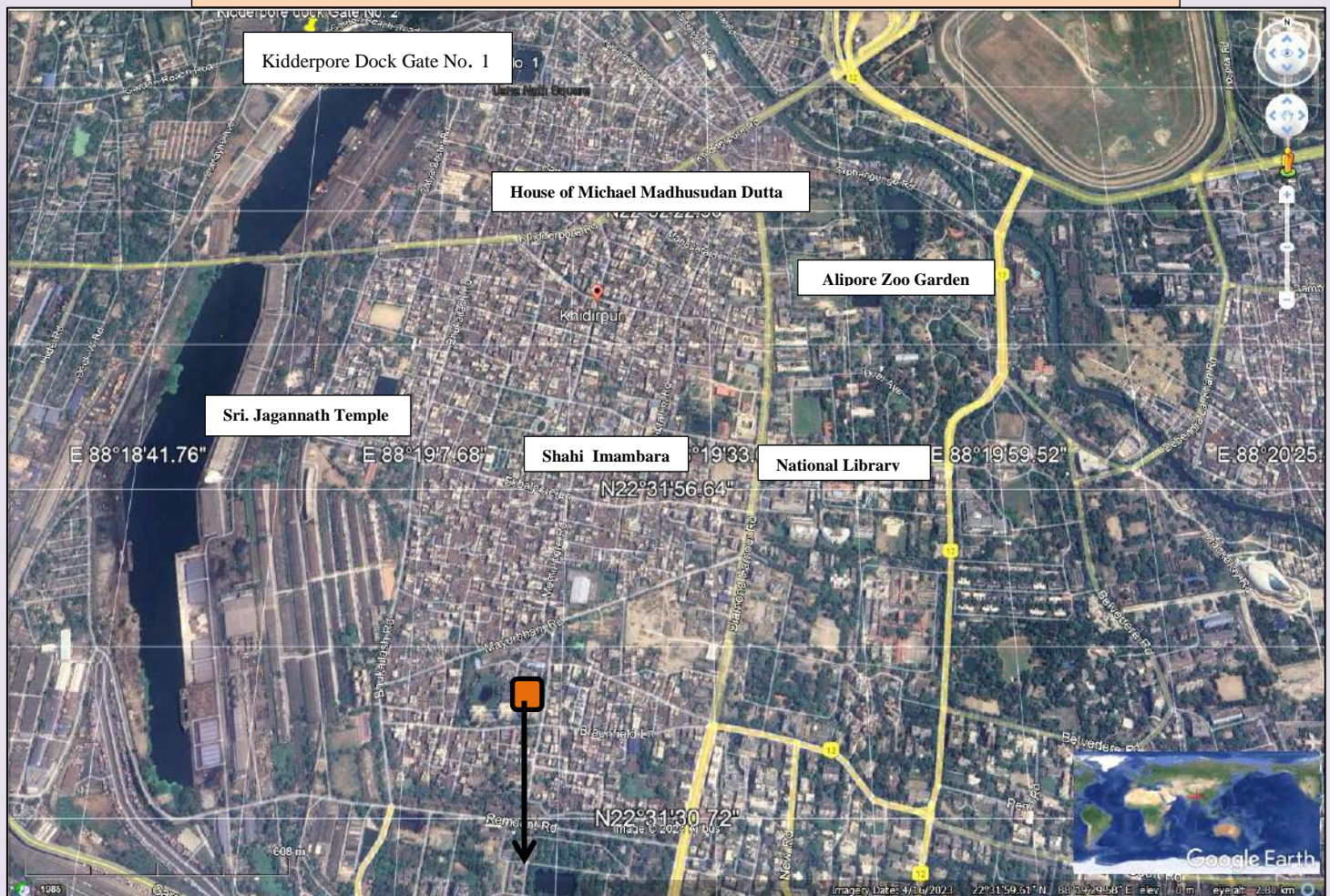
Community Oriented Mission

Events organized by the Heritage Study Centre

With the objective for inclusive development of the learners and to generate awareness regarding the rich local history and Indian tradition of the locality of Kidderpore- Mominpore- Ekbalpur area, the study centre in collaboration with IQAC has already arranged two diversity programs/ events within the college premises - one in November 2019 before the Pandemic and another in November 2022 in the post Pandemic period involving the local community and NGOs within the tenure of 2019-2020 to 2022-2023 session .

Event 1

A brief report on Diversity Festival – Calcutta 23 in November 2019

Concept Note of the Diversity Festival :

*“Mujhmein Geeta ka saar bhi hai, ek urdu ka akhbaar bhi hai
Mera ek mahina Ramzan bhi hai, maine kiya toh Ganga snaan bhi hai”*

These lines from Hussain Haidry’s celebrated poem ‘Hindustani Musalmaan’ (2017) aptly describe the cosmopolitan nature of the main port area of the city of Kolkata – Kidderpore. Kidderpore area (comprising of Kidderpore, Mominpore and Ekbalpore) is not only noted for its chequered past but is still holding on to its pluralistic present. Amusingly enough, the multiplicity of Kidderpore is often mistaken to be a ‘melting pot’ where ‘other’ cultures have faded into oblivion to give way to a hegemonic, dominant Muslim culture. This assumption might be statistically true but its ambience is multi-ethnic. In ‘Ekbalpore: A Study in Contrast’ Syeda Ayesha Ali pertinently describes the cosmopolitan vibe of the area: “Residents (here) wake up to the call for the morning prayers, *Fajr Azaan*, and if they are still in bed this is followed by the sound of Church bells to rouse them (*Strangely Beloved* 133)”. The coexistence of English, Urdu, Oriya, Hindi, Bengali medium schools in the Kidderpore area bear out the point. Once a home to three of Bengal’s most prominent poets, this area champions in polyphonic life styles. Therefore, Kidderpore area, like a ‘salad bowl’, continues to nourish *Masjids* and *Imambaras*, along with Temples and Churches.

While some parts of our history and culture enjoy prominence, some risk being lost in the sands of time. Despite being the main port area of the city of Kolkata, which results in Kidderpore being one of the oldest yet busiest areas of the city, the metanarrative of Kolkata’s history have hardly included the potent mini narratives of the richly layered Kidderpore area. Thus, Kidderpore area remained as one of the lesser discussed and seldom visited places by the city’s educated middle classes and elites. Time has come to re-investigate this politics of representation, to unearth the cause of this exclusionary treatment, to interrogate whether Kidderpore area is really a Muslim ‘ghetto’ as portrayed in modern times by popular media or a proper amalgamation of everything that the city stands for.

The nature of the Diversity Festival organized by the Heritage study centre with IQAC of the college in November 2019 was in tune with its theme – *diverse*. Without restricting to a stereotypical, uniform, and formal structure, the celebration was split up into a number of micro activities which included neighbourhood walk, lectures on relevant issues by public figures, screen issue-based films, discussion on aspects of communal harmony during the day. Evenings, on both the days, would be replete with cultural programmes. Food kiosks comprising of local delicacies. These were expected to enhance knowledge about intangible cultural heritage of the area. Art installations would preach messages of peace and harmony. Most importantly, the festival brought the artists, activists, teachers, students from different colleges, communities, school children, career counsellors, documentary film makers, etc under a rainbow umbrella .

The festival was held on 29th and 30th November, 2019 at **Government Girls' General Degree College, Ekbalpore, a newly established government college in Mominpore**. Majority of the students as well as all the casual staff members belong to Kidderpore area. Since teaching and non-teaching members of the college, inhabiting from different parts of the State, are interacting with them on a daily basis, they have come to acknowledge the immense socio-cultural potential of the area. Collaboration with 'Know Your Neighbour', (an organisation which has been established in 2016, the same year as this college) was directed to convey a message of communal harmony, peaceful co-existence through intercultural dialogues and thereby attempting to build bridges amongst people, particularly at this time of social unrest. This programme was a part of College's extension activity that gave the college an opportunity to establish a network with its neighbourhood. It provided the students with an awareness and knowledge of the rich local culture and history that mostly go unnoticed in the general humdrum of life. They enjoyed the privilege of listening to a 13th century Urdu oral story telling art form, *Dastangoi*, in Urdu and Bengali. They also got familiar with various job opportunities in the Career counselling sessions on both the days of the festival. Film shows and documentaries, on topics of contemporary relevance enhanced their sensibilities and raised awareness on pertinent topics which guided them towards a better understanding of the social situation that surrounds them. The festival offered the students an enviable platform to showcase their talents in different co-curricular and cultural activities like poster making, designing rangoli, skit and verse dance programmes. In short, through this Diversity Festival the students got an unique opportunity to experience a cultural environment (which they have never experienced before) and to map future avenues in their lives.

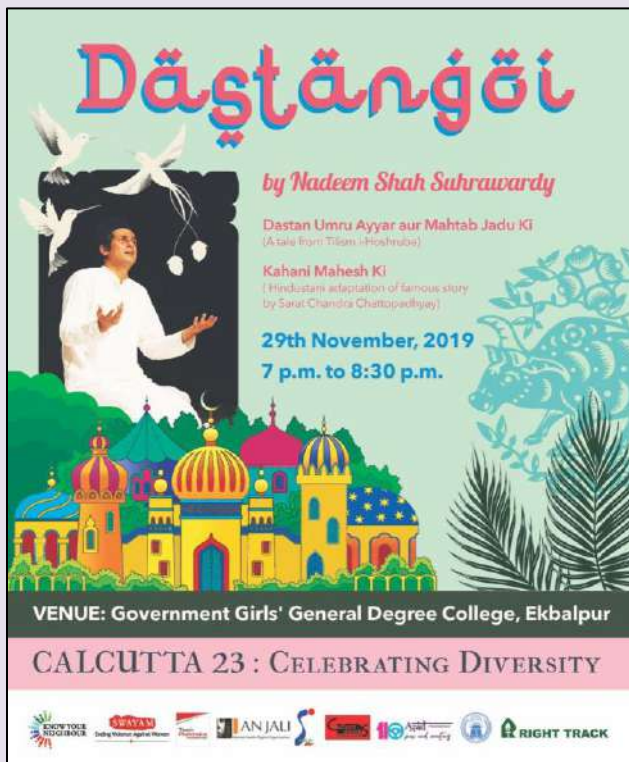

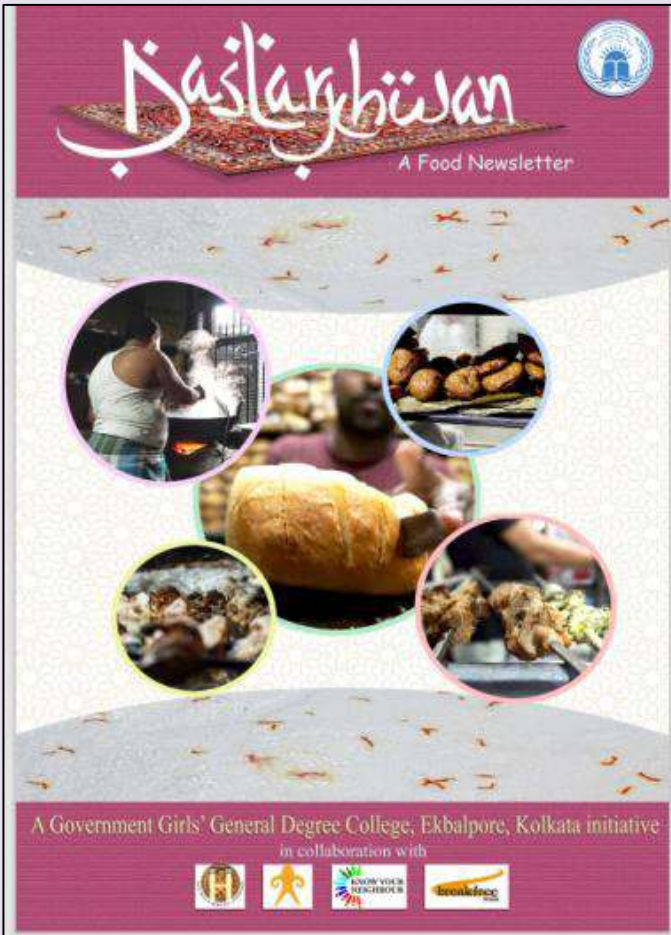
