




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5.1 Student Support

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Outline of different scholarship schemes available in the college

Scholarships: The primary goal is to enhance the economic capability and social fairness by providing financial support to students from low-income and underprivileged backgrounds.

The institution aware the students on different government scholarship schemes under Central and State Governments which they may apply as per rules and regulations.

The scholarship schemes that students generally apply from the Institute include

- ♣ Aikashree for minority students under the State Government
- Kanyasree and SVMCM for non-minority candidates supported by Higher Education Department, GoWB.

Based on merit and family means the students may apply under any of the scholarships but one at a time within their graduation course. The Students Welfare Sub-committee will take care of the applications under Aikashree and OASIS while the Kanyasree Subcommittee will supervise the applications submitted under Kanyasree scheme and SVMCM for non-minority candidates scheme. Institute level verification of the applications to be done examining all the required supporting documents under each scheme of the bonafide candidates by the nodal officers appointed by the college authority under each of the scholarship schemes. After institute level verification the applications will be forwarded to the district and State level for final approval.

- These scholarships are overseen by dedicated committees. Dr. Rajashree Dasgupta is
 the nodal officer for the Aikashree scholarship (SVMCM, Post Matric and Talent
 assistance) based on last pass examination marks and family income.
- Ms. Sutapa Bose is the nodal officer for the OASIS scholarships (for SC, ST and OBC).
- Dr. Shabnam Parveen acts as the nodal officer for Kanyasree scholarships. Kanyasree Committee is a separate subcommittee in the college who provides benefit to students applying under the Kanyasree Scheme.

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Flow Chart of Scholarship Application Process for Students

Step 1

 Application for online scholarships using the suitable scholarship portal and submission of the relevant supportive documents.

Step 2


 Review of documentation by three nodal officers for scholarships of Aikashree for minority students, Kanyasree and SVMCM for nonminority and OASIS before they are approved at the district level.

Step 3

 Once this process gets completed then these applications get forwarded to the next district level and state level for approval.

Step 4

 Finally, after state level verification of all necessary documents, the students receive the scholarship amount in their respective bank accounts.





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Book Grant Facilities: The Student Welfare subcommittee of Government Girls' General Degree College, founded in 2016 is dedicated for ensuring the social welfare of students from various backgrounds. Members of the subcommittee take every possible effort to provide financial assistance (from the college fund) to all minority and non-minority students in order to eliminate the social, cultural, and economic barriers.

Financial assistance is provided to the needy and meritorious students for purchasing books and other necessary study materials after their admission to the College in Semester I/ First Year. The students apply in plain paper addressing the Principal of the college explaining the need for the grant. Based on family means and marks obtained in the 10+2 level examinations, candidates are chosen in an interview for the Book grant conducted by Students welfare subcommittee members in the presence of the Principal and the IQAC Coordinator. The amount of the Book Grant varies among the selected individuals depending on their needs and family income. The grant provided by the college allows students to purchase books, necessary study materials, or both.
